Orderic Vitalis (Latin: Ordericus Vitalis; 1075 – c. 1142) was an English chronicler and Benedictine monk who wrote one of the great contemporary chronicles of 11th- and 12th-century Normandy and Anglo-Norman England. William Longsword (French: Guillaume Longue-Épée, Latin: Willermus Longa Spata, Old Norse: Vilhjálmr Langspjót; c. 893 – 17 December 942) was the second ruler of Normandy, from 927 until his assassination in 942. The church, by virtue of its position as one of the great medieval institutions, was also a great record-producer, and because the church (as a whole) survived, where individuals and many families did not, its records have been preserved better than many others.
